Before Bees

You are going to Abbotsford Convent to be part of an experience called *Bees* with performers from Polyglot Theatre.

Abbotsford Convent is a collection of very old buildings and gardens.

To get to the Convent, you will come down St Heliers Street. If your family is driving, you might park in the St Heliers Street carpark.



You will enter the Convent through the main entrance on St Heliers Street (Gate 1).

Your family will need to check in with a QR code, and show your vaccination certificates or exemptions.



Bees will be happening in the Heritage Garden. To get there, you will follow the paved path, past the cacti and signpost, around to the right and between the plants and the buildings.



Soon, you'll come to a big grassy lawn on your left. This is the Heritage Garden.



There will be friendly Abbotsford Convent and Polyglot staff members who will let you know that you're in the right place for *Bees*.

There will be colourful signs, and a large structure that looks like a honeycomb. If you want to touch it, please be very gentle. There will be colourful mats scattered around the grass.

Other families will also be arriving, and they will be part of *Bees* too.

There may be other Polyglot people there too.

You can say hello to all of these people, and play with them during Bees.

During Bees

When it's time for Bees to start, a Polyglot person will gather everyone together.

There will be paper, tissue paper and masking tape for everyone. You can use these to make yourself a Bee costume if you want to.



After a little while, you will hear sounds coming from portable speakers. There will be some buzzing bee noises, music and weather noises. Three human-size Bees will appear and move towards you and the other kids and families. The Bees are people wearing special costumes. You can stand back and look at them, or you can go close to them. If you touch them, please be very gentle.



The Bees will move around and make interesting movements. You can try these movements too, or maybe make up your own Bee movements.

Other kids and their adults will be moving around the Garden too, following the Bees or making their own Bee movements.

During *Bees*, you may have the chance to put your feet in special, safe coloured powder that is like bee pollen. You can make patterns on the grass. There will also be some things for you to smell if you like.

You can always stop and just watch or feel what is happening.

Your family can also leave whenever you are ready or want to have a break. You can come back to the session, or come to a different session.



When the Bees need to leave, they will start moving away from everyone.

The sounds will fade away.

After Bees

Once the *Bees* have gone, that means the session is finished.

Your family might like to move to another part of the Garden, or explore the Convent and find a nice spot for a drink, a picnic, or a rest.



Your family might like to leave straight away.

Your family can also stay and talk to the Polyglot and Abbotsford Convent staff members. You can tell them what you liked and didn't like about *Bees*, and how it made you feel.
