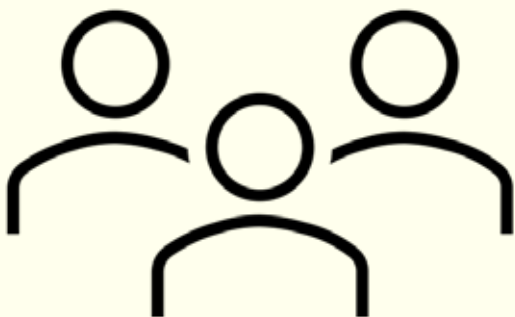
Before *Bees*
