Drive and park at one of the carparks in the city centre.




Catch a bus or train to

There will be colourful signs and friendly people who will let me know that I am in the right place. I can say hello if I want to.




There is a breakout area and baby change facilities if I need to rest, to feed my baby or change their nappy.



Other people will be arriving and they will also be part of *Pram People*, or they will be watching.




I will go to the marquee to get my name ticked off by the Front of House team.


