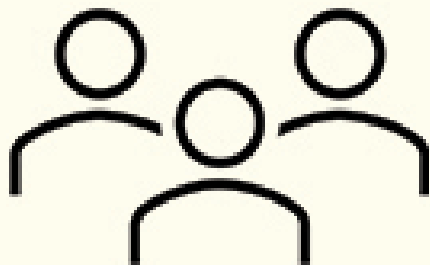
## Before *Art Tree*

I can draw on the paper on the floor, and on the paper around the trees.



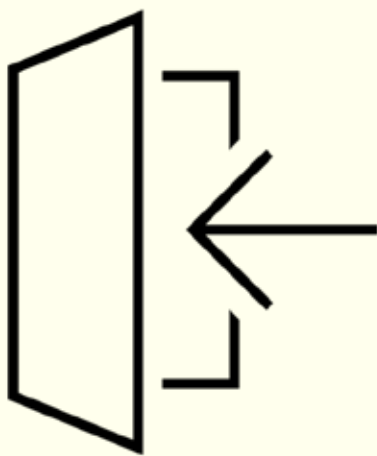
Other people will be creating and playing as well.
