I will enter through the Hub Entry. This is the entry closest to the upstairs room. There is a big park and playground near the entry.



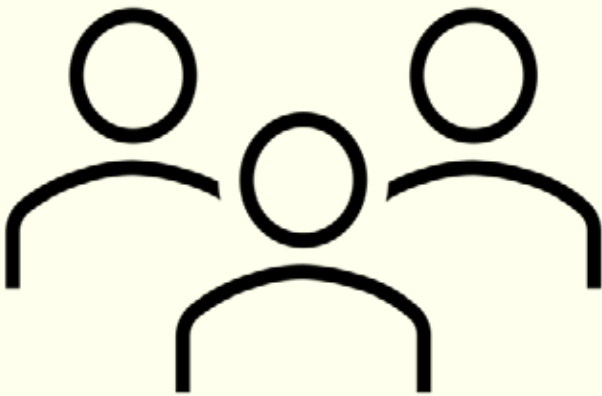
I will use the stairs or lift to go upstairs for *Paper Planet*.
