I will go to Brighton Town Hall to be part of an experience called *Art Tree* with artists from Polyglot Theatre.



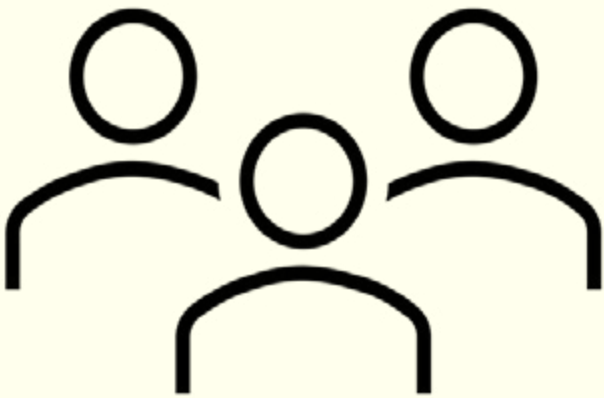
Brighton Town Hall is on the corner of Carpenter St and Wilson St.
