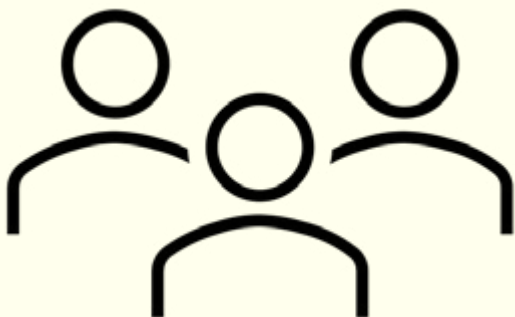
Before *Paper Planet*
